

The Canterbury of New Zealand "Uglies" – the original and the best

The original Canterbury of New Zealand team rugby jerseys were made in tough polyester /cotton and were supplied to both the local and national teams. By the early 1970s Canterbury of New Zealand was supplying kit to so many teams around the world that it's factories were left with a problem: what to do with the remnants of fabric that were used to make the many different jerseys of these teams? The solution: stitch them together and market them as 'practice' jerseys. With no two jerseys the same, these 'practice' jerseys became hugely popular with players and fans alike and before long became known as "Uglies".
